can provide?


- systematic analysis of the implications of continuation of past trends and patterns of behaviour

- precise predictions that can be used for detailed manpower planning (not a crystal ball)
- qualitative information on skills and competences




Modular approach ⇒ the Framework






Shift towards services continues...






Skills for Europe's future



All industries




Demand for all occupations...






...with signal of jobs polarisation






Qualification requirements raising across all occupations...






...even in elementary occupations

Total demand by qualification




2006-2015

Future priorities in forecasting

- Continuing dialogue: with country experts and stakeholders
- Overcome data problems: policy support needed to refine data
- Further refinement: the models/framework
- Complementary research: forecast of skills supply and more detailed analysis of skill needs at enterprise and sectoral level



On-going work & future plans

- Medium-term forecast of skills supply in Europe
 (EU-27, 2020) and identification of possible imbalances
 between supply and demand results early 2009
- Regular forecasts of skill needs and skills supply in Europe (2010, 2012) – support from DG Employment
- New initiative on employers' surveys as a tool for identification of skill needs – feasibility work started
- Contribution and support to the Commission "new skills for new jobs" initiative
