Main responsibility lies with the Member States





IMPLEMENTING THE SOCIAL AGENDA THE ROLE OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY - **CONSEQUENCES**

- Mainly seen as a catalyst for change facilitator
- Support to the Member States in meeting their commitments or converging towards EU objectives by:
 - Setting minimum standards common to all Member States
 - Agreeing on common EU objectives and monitoring progress made
 - Encouraging social and civil dialogue
 - Providing financial support (ESF)





PROGRESS MANDATE

 To strengthen the EU contribution in support of Member States' commitments and efforts to create more and better jobs and to build a more cohesive society



PROGRESS MANDATE - HOW

-by providing analysis and policy advice;

- -by monitoring and reporting on the implementation of EU legislation and policies in PROGRESS policy areas;
- -by favouring policy transfer, learning and support among Member States on EU objectives and priorities.
- -by relaying views of the stakeholders and society at large

 to favour the convergence towards EU objectives and priorities





PROGRESS INTERMEDIATE OUTCOME 2007-2013

Help strengthen partnerships with key EU and national policy-decision makers and stakeholders so as

- -to build a consensus and
- -to create an impulse for change in support of EU objectives and priorities



PROGRESS IMMEDIATE OUTCOME INFORMATION SHARING-LEARNING

Strategies:

- Partner with EU and national policy and decision-makers and stakeholders to identify best practices and develop assessment tools to assist them to improve policy-making and policy-implementation processes and outcomes.
- Ensure the effective transfer of acquired knowledge to policy and decisionmakers and stakeholders to advance EU law and policy with targeted information material and inputs
- Promote clarity and consistency in rights and obligations under EU law, through guidance and other informational materials.
- Communicate on EU law and policies using materials which are appropriate and responsive to the various segments of the target audiences

Outputs:

training & mutual learning - accurate monitoring/assessment reports -Identification & dissemination of good practices- Information & communication activities, networking



PROGRESS IMMEDIATE OUTCOME EVIDENCE-BASED POLICY

Strategies

✓ Establish an ongoing series of high quality, influential comparative policy research and analysis

✓ Collect relevant, credible and accurate information on the conditions, needs, concerns and expectations prevailing at EU and in the MS

✓ Develop fit-for purpose statistical tools and methods and common indicators capable of rallying EU-wide support

Outputs:

Development of appropriate statistical tools, methods, indicators related PROGRESS policy area -Appropriate policy advice, research & analysis related to PROGRESS policy areas

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PROGRESS IMMEDIATE OUTCOME CROSS-CUTTING WORK AND CONSISTENCY

Strategies:

- Integrate the gender dimension into all PROGRESS policy sections and activities and provide disaggregated data on gender participation when relevant
- Ensure that other equality considerations, among which disability accessibility requirements, are taken into account when in all PROGRESS policy sections and activities
- Promote consistently in all PROGRESS policy sections and activities- including in public communication - relevant cross-cutting issues

Outputs:

Cross-cutting and collaborative work among policy sections





PROGRESS IMMEDIATE OUTCOME GREATER CAPACITY OF KEY EU NETWORKS

Strategies:

 Strategically invest in the capacity of key EU networks to participate and influence policymaking and policy implementation at EU and national level in support of EU objectives and priorities

Outputs:

• NGOs, & networks active in PROGRESS policy areas





PROGRESS IMMEDIATE OUTCOME HIGH QUALITY AND PARTICIPATORY POLICY DEBATE

Strategies:

- ✓ Mobilise all key EU and national policy and decisionmakers and stakeholders to inform and advance EU law, policies and objectives
- Develop policy debate according to good governance principles

Outputs:

information & communication activities, networking between & with stakeholders & events on issues related to PROGRESS policy areas





METHOD OF IMPLEMENTATION

- Direct management by the Commission
- Commission is assisted by a Committee (with representatives from Member States)
- Approval by the Committee of the general guidelines for implementation and annual plans of work

Annual Plans of Work implemented through

- Call for tenders (contracts)
- Call for proposals (subsidies max 80% co-financing)



BUDGETARY APPROPRIATIONS

☐ 750 million €

- Spread over policy sections according to a key (Employment (23%), Social Inclusion (30%); Working Conditions (10%), Non-Discrimination (23%) and Gender Equality (12%)
- Budget for 2009: 106 million €
- Annual Plan of Work 2009 to be implemented through
 - 51 Calls for tenders (contracts)
 - 9 Calls for proposals
